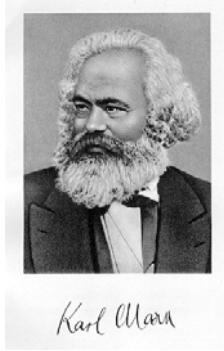

World Book Encyclopedia, online. Comprehensive access to encyclopedia articles, web links, periodical articles, videos, maps and more.

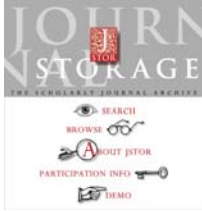
#### Ebsco Host



Includes three databases "MasterFILE Premier" -- for general reference, business, consumer health, general science, humanities, and multi-cultural periodicals, "Middle Search Plus" -- for middle and jr. high school students; and "Primary Search" -- for elementary school students. Also utilize Academic Search Premier for citations, abstracts, and

full-text access to articles from thousands of scholarly and peer-reviewed journals and other publications.

### **JSTOR**



A collection of core scholarly journals, many of which date from the 1800s. Current journals are not covered by JSTOR.

The database provides citations, abstracts, and indexing of the international serials literature in political science and its complementary fields, including international relations, law, and public administration / policy. Coverage from 1975 - present.

Journal citations and abstracts; book, chapter, and association paper abstracts; and book, film, and software review citations. Coverage from 1963-present.

One of the largest and most informative sites on the Internet for general information on Marxism and Socialism Included are the full texts of the works of socialists from the early utopians to modern socialist movements that can be downloaded on either Macs or Windows-based systems. Includes image galleries of writers, socialist art, and specific events in socialist history. There is a student section that gives links for the basic writings of the main socialist thinkers and short excerpts describing the texts' content, as well as offering definitions of political and economic terms.
